Students Take a Stand, Prevent Dating Violence

- Southwest PA Says No More invites students to submit videos about dating violence prevention -

WHAT: Teens and young adults are at the highest risk for all forms of dating violence, including verbal, emotional, physical and sexual abuse. Southwest PA Says No More has teamed up with the National NO MORE Campaign, Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh and Film Pittsburgh to invite students to participate in a video competition focused on preventing abusive behaviors. The **Take a Stand Against Teen Dating Violence Video Contest** aims to help students influence their peers' attitudes and behaviors.

Local high school and college students can submit 30 second videos for a chance to win prizes of \$500, \$300 and \$200. The videos must use one or more of the following elements:

- Show how someone can take action to prevent dating violence
- Show an example of non-physical abusive behavior
- Show an example of a healthy, mutually respectful relationship

The selected videos will be posted on Southwest PA Says No More's [website](#) and social media channels during Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month in February. Winning videos might also appear on other local or digital media.

WHEN: All entries must be submitted by **11:59 p.m. on Feb. 5, 2017**
Winners will be announced on **Feb. 21, 2017**
