Act 48 Credits

If you would like Act 48 credit, please let us know when you register and what school district you are in. You must have your Professional Personnel ID number at the close of the conference to receive Act 48 credits.

Counselors

Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic is an NBCC-Approved Continuing Education Provider (ACEP™) and may offer NBCC-approved clock hours for events that meet NBCC requirements. The ACEP solely is responsible for all aspects of the program. This program is being offered for 2.5 continuing education credits. **To receive these continuing education credits, there is a \$30 per person charge.**

Physicians (CME)

Other Healthcare Professionals

Nurses and other health care professionals are awarded .25 Continuing Education Units (CEU's). One CEU is equal to 10 contact hours. *Nurses:* For attending this program you will receive a Certificate of Attendance confirming 2.5 hours of continuing education. These hours may be considered eligible for completing the 30 hours of continuing education required for biannual nursing re-licensure in Pennsylvania. *Peer Specialists:* This program fulfills requirements for Certified Peer Specialist continuing education. **To receive these continuing education credits, there is a \$30 per person charge. Payment can be made by credit card or check (payable to OERP/WPIC) and must be paid at the event.**

Psychologists

Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic is approved by the American Psychological Association to offer continuing education for psychologists. Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic maintains responsibility for this program and its content. This program is being offered for 2.5 continuing education credits. **To receive these continuing education credits, there is a \$30 per person charge.**

Social Work, Licensed Professional Counselors, and Licensed Marriage and Family Therapists

This program is offered for 2.5 hours of social work continuing education through co-sponsorship of the University of Pittsburgh's School of Social Work, a Council on Social Work Education-accredited school and, therefore, a PA pre-approved provider of social continuing education. These credit hours satisfy requirements for LSW/LCSW, LPC and LMFT biennial license renewal.

Substance Abuse and other Behavioral Health Specialists

The Pennsylvania Certification Board (PCB) has approved 2.5 hours of continuing education credit for substance abuse and other behavioral health professionals. This includes: addiction counselors, prevention specialists, clinical supervisors, case managers, criminal justice addictions professionals, co-occurring disorders professionals, auxiliary professionals, recovery specialists and intervention professionals.
