Numerous Coaches Enrolled in Coaching Boys Into Men Training Program

Experts to prepare high school coaches to discuss healthy relationships and respect for women

WHAT: Pirates Charities, FISA Foundation and the United Way of Southwestern PA have invited area high school coaches to step up to the plate at the Coaching Boys into Men (CBIM) Program at PNC Park. According to a <u>CDC report</u>, nearly 1.5 million high school students throughout the country experience physical abuse from a dating partner in a single year. Coaching Boys into Men (CBIM) is an evidence-based program that seeks to combat dating violence and other abusive behavior by giving high school coaches the tools to talk to their athletes about healthy relationships and respecting women.

Throughout the day we will hear from athletes, presenters and coaches who have embraced this cause and/or implemented the program. In addition, participating high school coaches will partake in a series of hands-on exercises and roleplaying scenarios in this dynamic training program.
